My experience as a long-time coach and three-year university team captain further shaped my approach to leadership: setting a standard of discipline and accountability, investing personally in individuals, and cultivating a culture where each person understands their responsibility to the larger community.

Beyond this, the ability to educate students from a Christian lens is a gift that has tremendous value. I believe that teaching about and through God's work in the world can help instill joy and hope into a world that desperately needs it. I hope to be a light in the world through the way I teach, and the way I share my faith.
